Cloverdale's English Language Learner population is currently 25.3 percent. The LAS (Language Assessment Scale) is given to students whose home language survey indicates that English is not the primary language spoken in the home. The school's "English Language Learners (ELL)" are students identified as not proficient in the English language based upon the ELPA 21 which measures proficiency in and comprehension of English in literacy, speaking, and listening. A full-time English as a Second Language Bi-lingual Facilitator has been hired to address some of the barriers associated with instruction of this sub-population.

In addition to hiring a full time ESI facilitator, Cloverdale is in the process of seeking a part -time parent coordinator that will assist with providing intervention services and activities within or outside a school that will eliminate traditional barriers to learning.

City Year provides pull-in and push-out services as a student intervention **in** reference to students' academic coursework, behavior and pupil attendance. The school also has an intervention aide to assist with redirecting students whose behaviors may hinder their learning. Math 180 is a systemic program in place to address the needs of struggling students and their teachers, building students' confidence with mathematics and accelerating their progress to algebra. READ 180 and System 44 will provide Cloverdale with comprehensive support to meet the needs of the individual struggling reader and learner and place them on the path to College & Career Readiness. The intervention aide will be evaluated by Little Rock School District Classified Employee Handbook. All other programs and service effectiveness will be measured by quarterly and standardized assessments.
